**PRO-LIFE TEENS AT CAMP JOSHUA
BRINGING DOWN THE WALLS OF THE CULTURE OF DEATH**

On Friday, July 25th Pro-Life teenagers from around the state will meet in Little Rock to board a chartered bus that will take them to CrossHeirs Retreat Center in Humphrey, Arkansas to attend the 4th Arkansas Camp Joshua sponsored by the Youth Outreach of Arkansas Right to Life.

Camp Joshua is for students aged 14-19, and the cost is \$100 per student to attend the camp that begins on Friday evening July 25th and will end at the State Capitol on Sunday July 27th. The camp is for teens serious about making a difference in the pro-life movement.

Our Camp Joshua bears the name of Joshua, son of Nun, who transformed his character into action just as we want the students to be formed in pro-life convictions, able to live them out to others in word and deed so to save lives and bring down the walls of the culture of death.

Students that attend Camp Joshua learn about the basic issues of the pro-life movement: abortion, euthanasia and embryonic stem cell research. Friday evening's Abortion 101 explains fetal development and induced abortion procedures, and is presented by an OB/GYN physician. On Saturday there is Pro-Life Persuasion, The Impact of Abortion, Abortion Alternatives, and Euthanasia 101. Each session is followed by small group discussion.

Set on a 280 acre farm in Arkansas County, CrossHeirs Retreat Center provides a peaceful and secluded location to get away from it all and focus on what's really important while providing ample entertainment and fun activities for the students during the breaks and free time included in the Camp Joshua schedule.

On Sunday afternoon at 2:00 p.m. we will have the final session by Representative Andy Mayberry and a tour of the State Capitol followed by the Commissioning Ceremony at 3:00 p.m. in the Old Supreme Court Room. Camp Joshua concludes at 4:00 p.m.
