ARKANSAS RIGHT TO LIFE ELECTS ANDY MAYBERRY PRESIDENT

The Board of Directors of Arkansas Right to Life recently elected Andy Mayberry to succeed Wayne Mays as president of Arkansas Right to Life.

Mayberry is a former member of the Arkansas House of Representatives serving from 2011-2014 and for the past eight years has served as a director on the Board of Arkansas Right to Life.

During the 89th General Assembly, Andy was the lead sponsor on the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act (Act 701) that prevents most abortions past 20 weeks and has been in effect since its passage in February 2013.

Together with his wife Julie they own and manage a small advertising and publications business and are co-founders of I CAN! of Arkansas a non-profit that provides free activities for children with special needs. They are charter members of the Little Rock South Lions Club.

Andy is a native of Sheridan and a graduate of Henderson State University. He has lived more than 20 years in the East End community of Saline County. He and Julie have four daughters -- ages 8, 10, 13 and 15 -- and are members of East Union Missionary Baptist Church in East End.
