37th ANNUAL MARCH FOR LIFE

On Sunday, January 18, 2015 thousands of Arkansans will gather at 2:00 p.m. in Little Rock for the 37th Annual March for Life to mark the 42nd anniversary of the *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion.

Organized and sponsored by Arkansas Right to Life, the staging area for the March for Life will be on West Capitol between Battery & Wolfe Streets, behind the State Capitol. Marchers will split into two groups to the right and to the left to circle the State Capitol before joining back as one on the front steps for a brief program.

Wayne Mays, president of Arkansas Right to Life, will lead the march along with invited dignitaries and other special guests. The march will proceed as planned regardless of weather conditions.

The keynote speaker will be Governor Asa Hutchinson, a long-time supporter and friend of Arkansas Right to Life. Also attending are: U.S. Senator Tom Cotton, 2nd District U.S. Congressman French Hill, Lt. Governor Tim Griffin and many other pro-life Constitutional officers, State Senators and Representatives.

“The 2014 General Elections were very good for unborn children in our state and nation” said Executive Director Rose Mimms. “In Arkansas we have a 100% Pro-Life Congressional representation in the U.S. House, U.S. Senate, the State Capitol and have a pro-life majority in the AR General Assembly.”

“An unprecedented number of pro-life candidates have been elected to office that will result in significant pro-life legislation to restrict abortion, save unborn children and protect women in Arkansas until the time when we can overturn *Roe v. Wade*,” Mimms added.

Arkansas Right to Life’s top priority in 2015 is the passage of the Ban on Webcam Abortion. Legislation will be filed this week to make this the first pro-life legislation to be passed in the 2015 AR General Session.

Others participating in the program will be Father T. J. Hart, pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church in Marche and the Reverend Scott Stewart, pastor of Agape Church in Little Rock. Ms. Charisse Dean of Little Rock will perform musical selections.
