



## Web Cam Abortion Ban

## September 16, 2011

"Web-cam abortions" are abortions done by a video conferencing system where the abortionist is located at one location and uses a closed circuit TV to talk with a woman who is at another location over a computer video screen. The abortionist never sees the woman in person. They're never actually in the same room.

Several states have enacted laws requiring abortionist to be physically present in the room before administering chemical abortions upon pregnant women.
