Motor Vehicular Accident, catastrophic case

Internal abdominal hemorrhage s/p exploratory laparotomy with delayed closure, pelvic, liver and splenic hematoma, s/p splenectomy and hepatic artery embolization

Pelvic Ring Fracture with suprapubic hematoma, s/p pelvic ring fixation and sacroiliac screws placement (#2) for S1-S2 fracture, s/p pelvic fixator removal

Chest tube placement (#3) for pneumohemothoraces, pulmonary contusions and air leak; respiratory failure s/p tracheostomy

Traumatic Near-Death Experience (NDE) as a cause of:

Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

A traumatic stressor is defined as "any event (or events) that may cause or threaten death, serious injury, or sexual violence to an individual, a close family member, or a close friend."

The exposure can be "direct, witnessing (in person or indirectly), by learning that a close relative or close friend was exposed to trauma, or experiencing repeated or extreme indirect exposure to aversive details of the event(s), usually in the course of professional duties, as with first responders."

Traumatic Brain Injury(TBI)

"An alteration in brain function, or other evidence of brain pathology, caused by an external force like a blow to the head from a relatively blunt object or from blunt impact of the head with a stationary object."

Since my coma had persisted for more than an hour, and my post-traumatic amnesia, for more than 24 hours, which is classified as moderate to severe traumatic brain injury,

I had more extensive cognitive and behavioral changes.

These changes consisted of fatigue; attention deficits; learning and memory problems; impaired planning, problem solving, and concrete thinking; lack of initiative; inflexibility; dissociation between thought and action; impulsivity; sudden affective fluctuations from flatness to irritability, outbursts of temper, and crying spells; communication problems; and lack of insight and self-awareness.

An anxiety disorder experienced when "an event that is outside the range of usual human experience, such as a serious threat to one's life or physical integrity, or that of another person"
