ARKANSAS RIGHT TO LIFE (ARTL) is a non-profit public service organization. ARTL's primary purpose is to educate through the presentation of detailed and factual information about fetal development, abortion, alternatives to abortion, infanticide, euthanasia, and related issues, upon which individuals and the general public may make informed decisions.

ARTL supports a Human Life Amendment to the U.S. Constitution to make possible legal protection of all human beings and educated citizens to take constructive citizen action to protect the most basic human right - LIFE itself.

The legal protection of the right to life of innocent human beings is the basic issue upon which all other issues of human rights and justice depend. It is the pivotal human rights issue today, because once we abandon the basic democratic principle of equality – that ALL human beings deserve the protection of the law no matter what their size, their age or their degree of dependency – then the rights of all of us are less secure.

Although the current controversy concerning the right to life focuses on the unborn, decisions that society makes regarding abortion will have grave implications for the future – influencing society's acceptance of infanticide, euthanasia and other related bioethical issues.

ARTL believes that society's duty to those women whose pregnancies are complicated by medical, psychological, social or economic factors is to protect both mother and child by treating the complication and not by destroying the child. Therefore, we are working for alternatives to abortion and humane solutions to the problems of women who seek abortion.

ARTL recognizes that there are complex problems in caring for handicapped newborns and persons who are aged and infirmed, but we believe that problems must be solved with respect for the lives, individual rights and dignity of all human beings, especially those too young, too old or too physically ill or handicapped to defend themselves.

Members of ARTL are active in the pro-life movement within Arkansas. We come from many different social, economic, racial, religious, age and political backgrounds, and we are bound together by a common dedication to protecting all human life. Our cause is to foster and protect society's traditional respect for life by supporting the civil and human rights of the unborn, the defenseless, the aged, the disadvantaged, and all human life.







CROSSES FOR LIFE MEMORIAL EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH



The **Crosses for Life Memorial** is a traveling display of approximately 3,000 small white crosses to represent the deaths of unborn children killed by legal abortion every day in America and to bring awareness to this tragic loss of human life.

- The Crosses for Life trailer will be transported to your location with a complete layout diagram and materials along with the instructions on the packing and loading of the crosses and a sample Press Release to raise community awareness.
- Arkansas Right to Life schedules the display throughout Arkansas during the months of March through November.
- The display can be hosted by churches, Right to Life groups and others ministries that help to promote the sanctity of human life and educate the general public on the toll that legal abortion has taken on our nation since the legalization of abortion in 1973.
- A fee of \$250 is required for use of the display and is used to cover expenses to maintain the display, replace wooden crosses with plastic and transportation costs. A deposit of \$100 is paid on delivery of the trailer but is returned if the trailer and contents are returned in good order.
- Each hosting group is asked to issue a press release and to plan an ecumenical Dedication Service upon the completion of the set up or on the next day and invite area churches.

We pray that the **Crosses for Life Memorial** outreach will be a blessing to every community and a reminder that abortion kills unborn children so that America will end the slaughter of the innocents.

"A perfect little bud – clipped before she blossomed." In memory of those lives lost through abortion.

On April 28, 1983, a baby girl was found, legally aborted, and tossed into a drainage ditch in Little Rock. She weighed 5 pounds, was 7 months in gestation, 16 inches long, had a full head of auburn hair, brown eyes, and ivory skin. Given a Christian burial by North Pulaski Right to Life, Chapter of Arkansas Right to Life, Mary Rose has touched our hearts, and none of us will ever forget her.

In 1985, the first "Mary Rose Doe" award was presented to journalist Mike Masterson, who followed her death and burial, and helped, through his recognition of her as a person, to grant her the "personhood" that the United States Supreme Court denied her and countless other abortion victims through their 1973 *Roe vs. Wade* decision.

Arkansas Right to Life gives the Mary Rose Doe Award to honor those who have "gone that extra mile" in their work and efforts on behalf of unborn children. It is a small way of the Right to Life movement telling Mary that we love her and that we will always remember her, and that her breif little life was not in vain.





1. H.R. 26 Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act

The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (H.R. 26), sponsored by Congresswoman Ann Wagner (R-Mo.), would enact an explicit requirement that a baby born alive during an abortion must be afforded "the same degree" of care that would apply "to any other child born alive at the same gestational age," including transportation to a hospital. The bill also empowers women with a right to sue their abortionists and others for harm caused by violations of the act.

2. H.Con. Res. 3 Resolution condemning attacks on pro-life facilities, groups, and churches

The Biden Administration has systematically failed to respond to numerous attacks on pregnancy care centers, pro-life groups, and churches that occurred in reaction to the Dobbs v. Jackson Supreme Court decision. There have been more than 100 documented incidents in the time after the leaked Dobbs decision until today. The resolution condemns "recent attacks of vandalism, violence, and destruction against pro-life facilities, groups, and churches," and calls on the Biden Administration to use its authority to protect the rights of such organizations. In addition, the resolution "recognizes the sanctity of life and the important role pro-life facilities, groups, and churches play in supporting pregnant women, infants, and families." This resolution recognizes that pregnancy care centers, pro-life groups, and churches should continue to be able to serve the needs of women in their communities without fear of violence.

ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION

AMENDMENT 68.

Sec. 1. Public funding.

ABORTION. No public funds will be used to pay for any abortion, except to

save the mother's life.

Sec. 2. Public policy.

The policy of Arkansas is to protect the life of every unborn child from conception until birth, to the extent permitted by the Federal Constitution.

Sec. 3. Effect of amendment.

This amendment will not affect contraceptives or require an appropriation of public funds
